About: Gray Davis was overwhelmingly elected the 37th governor of California in 1998 and re-elected in 2002. As Governor, he prioritized education, signing legislation to strengthen California's K-12 system and expanding access to higher education. Governor Davis made record infrastructure investments and created four Centers of Science and Innovation on UC campuses. In late 2023, in recognition of his commitment to education and innovation, Governor Davis received the UC President's Medal - the University of California's highest honor. Governor Davis has served of counsel at Loeb & Loeb LLP for nearly two decades.

Before serving as Governor, he graduated cum laude from Stanford University and then went on to receive a Columbia University Law School degree. He also served as a U.S. Army Captain in Vietnam and was awarded the Bronze Star for meritorious service.
