Hands-on, Practical Training

Named one of the best law schools for practical training, the Fowler School of Law provides a rigorous legal education rooted in a practice-ready curriculum. We teach both tangible skills and conceptual theory. We seize the opportunity to represent real clients and strategize with some of the brightest legal minds in the nation. Everything we do prepares our students to become the best lawyers possible, so that when the world calls on them, they will be ready for anything.



Clinical Education Programs

We're committed to training skillful, ethical lawyers. That's why we've established innovative and exciting clinical offerings, giving students invaluable hands-on experience and providing real benefits to the surrounding community.

In our legal clinics, students work on actual cases under the supervision of clinical specialists and seasoned practitioners. In addition to classroom training sessions, students engage in hands-on fieldwork with clients, research projects, document preparation, brief writing and court appearances. These clinical programs provide pro-bono services to members of the community in need of legal aid.

Alona Cortese Elder Law Center

The Alona Cortese Elder Law Center provides free legal services to low income seniors throughout the County of Orange. Students learn key aspects of elder law while obtaining hands-on experience representing real clients. The center works closely with local legal aid organizations and pro-bono attorneys to maximize services provided to seniors.

Bette and Wylie Aitken Family Protection Clinic

At the Bette & Wylie Aitken Family Protection Clinic, students facilitate educational workshops and provide legal advice, assistance, and representation to low-income and homeless survivors of domestic violence. Advanced Clinic students learn trial skills and may represent a domestic violence survivor in the Orange County Superior Court.

Constitutional Jurisprudence Clinic

The Constitutional Jurisprudence Clinic provides an opportunity for students to learn about the original understanding of the Constitution from esteemed professors, and to put those lessons into practice by crafting arguments in briefs filed in appellate courts and the United States Supreme Court. Students also conduct research, draft discovery, prepare motions and attend hearings.

Entertainment Contracts Law Clinic

The Entertainment Contracts Law Clinic provides students with a unique opportunity to work directly with independent filmmakers, serving as production legal counsel for feature length motion pictures. Under the supervision of veteran entertainment law faculty, participating students set up corporations and LLCs, file for copyrights, and draft all production-related contracts.

Mediation Clinic

The Mediation Clinic allows students to develop and use mediation skills through frequent practice with actual clients under the supervision of a mediation professor and mediators in the Superior Court. Students gain hands-on experience with real litigants in a variety of different areas, mediating approximately 700 cases each year.

Tax Law Clinic





Finance Your Future

Financial Aid

Attending law school is an investment in yourself and your future. We understand — and that's why we offer a generous scholarship program. We want you to maximize your resources and make the best decisions for your personal situation.

Merit Scholarships:

Admitted first-year students are automatically considered for merit scholarships based on undergraduate cumulative GPA and LSAT at the time of admission. Applications are due by **April 15**.

Additional Scholarships:


All admitted students are eligible to apply for additional scholarships. Applications for these scholarships are typically processed in March.

First Generation Scholarship: Open to admitted students who are the first members of their immediate family to earn an undergraduate degree. Applicants with a demonstrated commitment and/or history of service to legally underserved communities or populations are given priority.

Bergener & Mirejovsky Scholarship: Open to admitted students who have worked full-time for at least one year (preferably in a legal setting) or are seeking a legal education to pursue a second career are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Federal Loans:

A completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with Chapman University listed (school code 001164) is required to be eligible for Federal Direct Loans and need-based scholarships. Visit studentloans.gov for more information.



Private Loans:

Private loans are offered by lenders for international students and students who do not qualify or do not wish to borrow federal loans.

Yellow Ribbon Program

Through the Yellow Ribbon Program, Chapman University will contribute up to \$17,500 towards qualifying tuition and fees per academic year (and the Veterans Administration will contribute matching funds) for eligible military veterans.

Application Checklist

To be considered for admission to the JD program, all applicants must submit an application via Isac.org, which includes the following:

- Resume: a description of your work experience, community involvement, volunteer work, scholastic honors and achievements, and/or extracurricular activities after high school. Must be typewritten as an attachment with your electronic application.
- Personal Statement: a brief statement indicating your reasons for wanting to study law, why you chose to apply to Fowler School of Law and any further information you feel should be considered by the Law Admission Committee. Must not be more than three pages in length, must be typewritten, 12-point font, double-spaced and submitted as an attachment with your electronic application.
- LSAT & LSAC's Credential Assembly Service (CAS): applicants must furnish their results of the Law School Admission Test (LSAT), register for the Law School Admission Council (LSAC) Credential Assembly Service (CAS) and pay all LSAC-mandated fees. Only LSAT scores that fall within the five-year reportable period will be considered.
- Letters of Recommendation: letters must be submitted through the LSAC Letter of Recommendation Service that serves all member schools. The maximum number of letters we will review is three.
