## Majoring and Minor in German

The German Program offers courses that develop communications skills in both written and spoken German which foster an understanding of and appreciation for German literature and culture. In addition to our regularly scheduled courses in German language, culture, literature, cinema, and business students in the program have opportunities to spend a semester at one of our partner universities in Germany, join a study abroad program, and obtain travel internships.

**INTEGRATED** curriculum that requires students to take a variety of classes and present their original research senior year.

**INTERDISCIPLINARY** curriculum that allows students to explore a range of topics, methodologies, iconography, material culture, social history, gender studies, and ethnic studies within their general education core.

**INDIVIDUAL** mentorship and internship opportunities are available to students.

**INTERNATIONAL** opportunities are encouraged by studying abroad or taking travel courses in a student's sophomore or junior year.
