

The goal of the minor is to prepare students to think critically and analytically about the role of law in our lives, using the tools of a well-rounded education in the liberal arts. It also teaches core competencies that help prepare for law school admissions.

The minor has two tracks of elective courses, which bring together courses from across the curriculum. These tracks are organized around themes: (1) Justice, Morality, and the Law; (2) Global Justice and International Law.

Law and the liberal arts is an interdisciplinary minor that helps Chapman students reflect on the place of the law in our society, as well as prepare for law school admissions.

Courses within Law and the Liberal Arts stem from a variety of different programs and disciplines. As such, they will expose students to the various methodological and pedagogical commitments of these as well. The variation reflects the interdisciplinary nature of the minor. Through this exposure to different disciplinary approaches, students will develop skills and competencies relevant to the study of the place of law in society.
