# REMEMBERING WAR IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

Who is a patriot? Who are our idols? How do we honor the fallen? The exhibition *Remembering War in Southern California* asks us to consider these timely questions in the context of war memorials in our own neighborhoods. A project by Chapman University's MA Program in War and Society Studies, this exhibition presents ten monuments memorializing a wide range of wars: the Doughboy Memorial in Pershing Square, Los Angeles Coliseum, dedicating service in World War I; the US Submarine Veterans Memorial in Seal Beach honoring those who served in World War II; the Korean Bell of Friendship in San Pedro; and the Vietnam War Memorial in Westminster.
