### **2019** INTERFAITH DIVERSITY EXPERIENCES & ATTITUDES LONGITUDINAL SURVEY (IDEALS)

Interfaith Diversity Experiences & Attitudes Longitudinal Survey (IDEALS) is a longitudinal study that focuses on understanding student encounters with religious, spiritual, and worldview diversity on college campuses. Chapman University is one of 122 institutions across the nation that participates in this survey. During Fall of 2015 (T1), over 280 freshmen completed the survey online resulting in a 20% response rate. In Fall 2016, a second follow-up survey (T2) was sent to students who completed the first survey resulting in 122 usable survey responses. In Spring 2019, the third survey (T3) was sent, resulting in 112 usable survey responses and a 44% response rate. This newsletter will focus on the third survey (T3) results and will also include and compare some data from T1 and T2 surveys.


