Honors courses – GE credits; major/minor credits (with approval)*

Here’s what Honors credits can do for you: *

Students take 9 courses to complete the Honors Program (7 HON courses plus Honors Forum and Senior Capstone).

Transfer students, with 60 credits prior to matriculation, take 6 courses (4 HON courses plus Honors Forum and Senior Capstone).

1. Completion of the Honors Program automatically fulfills the I/M GE cluster.
2. Honors courses can be assigned to fulfill one GE category each (see #3 about major/minor/GE stipulations)
3. If a student wants to assign an Honors course to fulfill a GE category AND a major or minor credit:
 - a. Up to 3 Honors courses can be assigned to fulfill both GE and major requirements.
 - b. Up to 2 Honors courses can be assigned to fulfill both GE and minor requirements.
4. Courses under multiple Honors categories can only be assigned to one category.
5. A semester-long study abroad course can count as an Honors elective course.
