

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Online Application
- Official Transcripts
- Statement of Intent
- Critical Essay: A Finished Essay of 12–15 Pages that focuses on literary or rhetorical analysis; informed by contemporary literary, rhetorical and/or cultural theory and criticism
- Creative Portfolio: 20–30 Pages of Fiction or Nonfiction, or 10–15 Pages of Poetry
- Two Letters of Recommendation
