

Integrated Program BS/MS in Pharmaceutical Sciences

Chapman University School of Pharmacy and the Schmid College of Science and Technology are pleased to offer an Integrated BS/MS in Pharmaceutical Sciences (MSPS). The program is open to all undergraduate biochemistry, molecular biology, chemistry and biological sciences majors who meet the admissions requirements. Students develop a personalized program of study with a faculty mentor tailored toward their career goals, culminating in a thesis based on original research.

The School of Pharmacy is strategically located at the Rinker Health Science Campus in Irvine near a variety of pharmaceutical, biomedical and medical device companies. Graduates will also be positioned to work as researchers at universities, for agencies such as the Food and Drug Administration, U.S. Pharmacopeia and at national laboratories such as the National Institutes of Health. Students have also used the MSPS as a springboard to applying to medical school, veterinary school and Ph.D. programs.

BENEFITS OF THE INTEGRATED PROGRAM

- Earn your master's degree within one year from coursework during senior year.
- Prepare for careers in pharmaceutical and biotech industries.
- Gain valuable experience through internships and research with world-class faculty.

APPLY IN YOUR JUNIOR OR SENIOR YEAR

Chapman students can apply to the MS program in their junior or senior year. If accepted into the program, undergraduate students may take up to 15 graduate credits once they have completed 90 undergraduate credits. These 15 credits can be used to satisfy the undergraduate graduation requirements AND count toward the MS program. Students would take the research rotation course during summer after receiving the undergraduate degree and finish remaining graduate coursework in fall and spring.

CURRICULUM INFORMATION

The Integrated program provides research opportunities for undergraduate seniors through the Bridge to Graduate School Program prior to starting their graduate studies. While completing an undergraduate BS degree, students enrolled in the Integrated program will complete 9–12 credits of MSPS courses in their senior year.

The remaining coursework will be completed post-graduation while matriculated full time in the graduate program. Students enrolled will complete the minimum 36 credit hour requirement for the MSPS degree in two years, including required courses, elective courses, credits of research and credits of thesis.
