

INTERFAITH DIVERSITY EXPERIENCES & ATTITUDES LONGITUDINAL SURVEY (IDEALS)

Chapman University is one of 122 institutions across the United States participating in a longitudinal study focused on understanding student encounters with religious, spiritual, and worldview diversity on college campuses. The first survey was sent to first time, full time Chapman students entering Fall 2015. Over 280 first time students completed the first Interfaith Diversity Experiences & Attitudes Longitudinal Survey resulting in a 20% response rate. In Fall 2016, the second survey was sent to students who completed the first survey resulting in 122 usable survey responses--a 44% response rate. This newsletter will focus on the Time 2 (T2) follow-up survey results but will also include some findings from the initial Time 1 (T1) survey.

89% Studied with someone of a different religious or nonreligious perspective.




84% Dined with someone of a different religious or nonreligious perspective.

I am actively learning about people across the globe who have different religious and cultural ways of life than I do.




I frequently think about the global problems of our time and how I will contribute to resolving them.



Percent "agree somewhat" or "agree strongly"
