2024 COLLEGE SENIOR SURVEY (CSS)

Each year, thousands of students across the United States complete the College Senior Survey, a national survey from the Higher Education Research Institute at UCLA. The results in this newsletter profile Chapman University's graduating class of 2024. The CSS was administered in Spring 2024. Approximately 171 graduating seniors completed the survey online, resulting in a 9% response rate. Although many of the findings align with those of previous years, it is important to interpret the 2024 results cautiously due to the potential limitations in generalizability and reliability caused by the low response rate.




ARTIST SELF-CONCEPT
