Leatherby Family Alcove

This alcove honors the Leatherby Family and their generous contributions to the Leatherby Libraries and Chapman University.



The Short Story Dispenser

A kiosk in the library that can dispense short stories ranging from 1-3-5 minutes and allows students, faculty, and visitors to receive free, randomly selected poems, cartoons, or stories at the push of a button.



The Black Book Nook provides titles by Black authors on Black history, thought, literature, and culture.



Joyce Marion Chapman Rotunda **Study Commons & Cafe**

The Rotunda, the architectural icon of the building is named after Chapman trustee (and descendant of the Chapman family) Joyce Marion Chapman.

Alumni Association Reading Alcove

The Alumni Association Reading Alcove is a newly furnished alcove highlighting the scholarship of Chapman University alumni.



Doy and Dee Henley Reading Room

The Doy and Dee Henley Reading Room is a space filled with comfortable chairs that allow students to study alone or collaborate during group study sessions.

Town and Gown Alcove

This alcove symbolizes the partnership between the Leatherby Libraries and Town & Gown. It is dedicated to Town & Gown in recognition of its ongoing support for Chapman students.



Vernon L. Smith Reading Alcove

This alcove consists of books and information from the personal library of Vernon L. Smith, professor of economics at Chapman University's Argyros College of Business and Economics.

The Jack and Belle Lindquist Disney Collection consists of personal Disney memorabilia from former Disneyland President Jack Lindquist, which he collected throughout his career at the Disney Company.



Henri Temianka Archives Multimedia Room




This study room is dedicated to the late Henri Temianka, one of the last century's foremost concert violinists and leading figures in classical music.

This room honors John N. LaCorte, an important member of the Italian-American community. This space offers relevant information and resources about the cultural significance of Italian heritage.
