Currently teaching Movement (TART 1B), Introduction to Theatre (TART 25) and Acting I (TART 1)

- Acting I (TART 1) introduces the student to the fundamental elements and techniques of
 acting. The student actor will explore the theory and practice of acting through acting
 exercises, improvisation, theatre games, solo and two-person or group scenes. The course
 also explores the concepts of acting through relaxation, concentration, sensory awareness
 and imagination as the student develops both an understanding and appreciation of acting for
 the theatre.
- Movement (TART 1B) introduces students the use of the human body as an instrument of
 expression. The course provides for the study and application of the basic theories and
 principles of stage movement through the use of lecture and class exercise.
- Introduction to Theatre (TART 25) provides a critical analysis of theater from an audience
 perspective. The elements of play production from dramatic structure, to the final
 presentation will be explored. Topics include reading, lectures, discussions on the theory and
 practice of acting, directing, producing, styles, design spectacle, and cultural background.
 Field trips and performance attendance is required for this course.
- Day Rehearsal and Performance (TART 49AD) this course is designed to give students an
 opportunity to both act and crew a one act play. Responsibilities include: directing a one act
 play, set, lighting, prop, costume and sound design. Overseeing Stage Manager
 responsibilities and crew assignments, mentoring students in the responsibilities of stage
 management and crewing backstage.

 This course focuses on learning how to safely and effectively perform moments of violence in the context of scene work from dramatic literature. Students will explore the fundamentals of Small Sword and Broadsword & Shield stage combat through analysis, practical application, and performance while improving kinesthetic awareness as well as enhancing confidence in heightened dramatic situations.

- Acting II (TA 1420) deepens an actor's understanding of text analysis, objectives, actions, personalization, physcialization, use of objects and space while applying these skills towards contemporary comedic scenes and monologues.
- Stage Combat (TA 5244) students demonstrate physical comprehension of safe, dynamic knife and unarmed techniques through the standards and practices created by the Society of

American Fight Directors; in order to execute clear objectives and actions while performing fight choreography in scene work.

Develop self-awareness to evaluate oneself as a teacher when confronted with challenges in the classroom. Create a clear description of their individual teaching philosophy and methodologies and how it aligns with the pedagogy of the undergraduate acting program at CSULA.
