Honoring U.S. Military Veterans and their Families by Preserving War-Related Correspondence

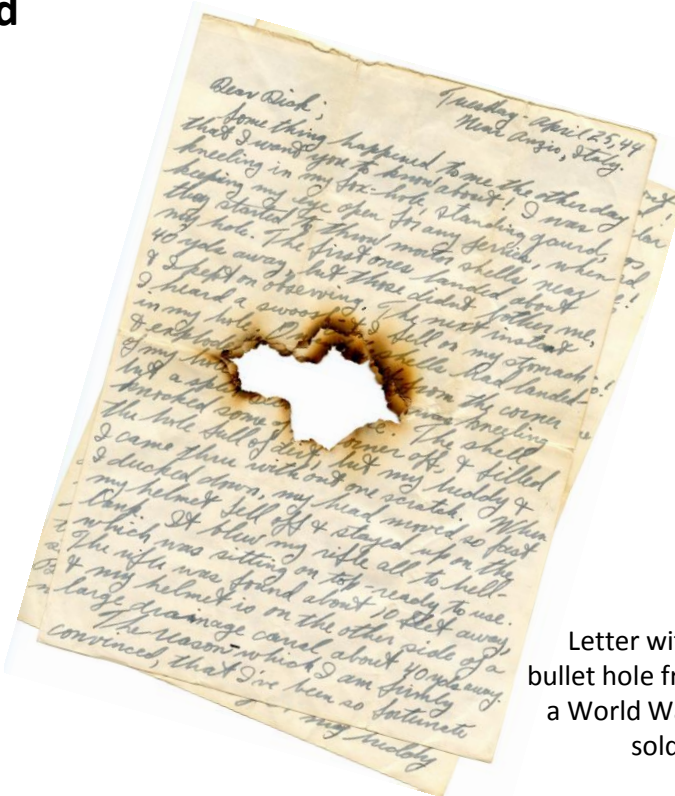
