Dear Educator:

We invite you and your students to participate in the 16th Annual Holocaust Art and Writing Contest, Through Discovery to Action: Making Meaning from Memory.

Enclosed you will find a poster for the event, a DVD we encourage you to share with your students, the writing prompt and background information in a form that can be copied for your students, and a reply card to let us know of your participation in the contest. Each school is invited to submit a total of three entries, consisting of **art**, **film or writing** (**prose**, **poetry**, **article**) from three individual students.

Beginning this year, schools will be eligible to win a first-place award of \$500, given in honor of a first-place entry from their school. The prize for the first-place student in each category will be an expense-paid study trip for the student, a parent/guardian and sponsoring teacher to Washington, D.C. The trip this year will be June 21-25, 2015 to visit the United States Holocaust Museum and other sites in the nation's capital. The prize for the second place student in each category will be \$250, awarded at the ceremony on March 6, 2015.

We encourage you to display the poster in your classroom and to participate in the contest as a class project or as a collaborative effort with other teachers, making the contest a department or a school-wide activity.

To participate, please:

- Register via reply card or at the art and writing contest website (www.chapman.edu/holocaust-arts-contest) by October 22, 2014.
- Postmark/send electronically your school's entries beginning December 5, 2014. All submissions must be postmarked no later than February 3, 2015.
- Attend awards ceremony at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, March 6, 2015. Student school representatives <u>must</u> be in attendance to receive prizes and to be eligible for the study trip to Washington, D.C.

We hope that *Through Discovery to Action: Making Meaning from Memory* becomes a theme in your classroom throughout the year.
