

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the Holocaust Art & Writing Contest. Launched in 1999 as a partnership between the Rodgers Center for Holocaust Education at Chapman University and The “1939” Club, now The 1939 Society, the contest has grown from a few local schools to become a national, and increasingly, an international one. This year the contest includes more than 230 registered schools and thousands of students.

This growth would not have been possible without the extraordinary support of the Chapman University administration; The 1939 Society; and our various benefactors, especially the Samueli Foundation and Dana and Yossie Hollander, whose generosity makes possible our annual study trip for first-place students and their teachers.

A special word of appreciation must go to Louis Weber and Publications International for twenty-five years of extraordinary support and the close to 10,000 copies of *The Holocaust Chronicle: A History in Words and Pictures* they have donated. Thanks to Publications International, each school receives a book which they can have signed by Holocaust survivors and their families, and by other participants and guests attending the reception following the awards ceremony. With these signatures, each book becomes a unique testimony to the memories created on this very special day that furthers knowledge and memory of the Holocaust and inspires commitment to making the words “never again” a reality.

And lastly, the idea for this contest originated with the president of The 1939 Society, William Elperin. During the first years of the contest, at the awards ceremony, we were blessed with the presence of nearly a hundred members of The “1939” Club. This year, as we mark our 25th anniversary, very few who are witnesses to the Holocaust are still physically able to be with us, although many are viewing the live feed of our program. In spite of their physical absence, the spirit of all those who have taught, mentored, and inspired us over the last two decades is very much present—their memories and their voices now live within the more than 150,000 students who have participated in 25 years of the contest. We are honored to include messages from some of these beloved mentors and friends in this year’s program.
