The following information is a guide of Fullerton College courses that transfer to Chapman University to fulfill general education requirements.

Chapman accepts the IGETC or full CSU general education certification to satisfy the following areas: All Shared Inquiry, Global Study and Citizenship, Community, and Service. See shaded areas below. Certification must be completed prior to the student’s first semester admitted, enrolled and attending.

**A course may be approved for multiple areas but can only be applied towards one.
Up to 9 credits may be shared between major courses and GE Shared Inquiry and/or Global Citizen Clusters.**

A minimum grade of C- is required for all transfer coursework.
