The Africana Studies minor is designed to examine the histories, cultures, societies, literatures, and arts of people of African descent and their contributions to world civilization.

As a result of completing coursework through the minor, students will be able to understand the core historical experiences of people of African descent and/or the African Diaspora, as well as compare current social issues facing the Africana world to global historical processes and events. Using interdisciplinary theoretical and methodological approaches, students will read, analyze and critically assess the contemporary socioeconomic, political and cultural issues facing people of African descent.
