## Overview

Chapman University engaged SSRS to conduct the 2018 wave of The Chapman University Survey on American Fears (CSAF). Chapman University initiated this nationwide poll on what strikes fear in Americans in 2014. The primary objective of this survey is to collect annual data on the fears, worries and concerns of Americans, the personal, behavioral and attitudinal characteristics related to those fears, and how those fears are associated with other attitudes and behaviors.

The CSAF is a project of the Earl Babbie Research Center in the Wilkinson College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences at Chapman University. The Earl Babbie Research Center is dedicated to using a variety of social science research methods to examine critical social, behavioral, economic and environmental problems.

CSAF was conducted online via the SSRS Probability Panel and invited adults age 18 and older to participate via the web. It included 1,190 participants and data collection was conducted from June 25 to July 10, 2018.

This report provides information about the sampling procedures and the methods used to collect, process, and weight data for the 2018 wave of the CSAF.

## SSRS Profile

## Questionnaire Design

Chapman University provided the survey instrument to SSRS. SSRS reviewed the survey instrument and provided feedback. Together, SSRS and the Chapman University team worked to finalize the questionnaire.

Upon final approval, SSRS formatted and programmed the survey for completion online. Additional steps were employed to ensure a quality experience in survey administration regardless of the device utilized by respondents, whether a desktop computer, tablet or phone.



## Sample Design: The SSRS Probability Panel

The SSRS Probability Panel is nationally representative probability-based web panel. Given that this is a probability-based web panel, findings are statistically projectable to the adult general population. SSRS Probability Panel members are recruited randomly from a dual-frame random digit dial (RDD) sample, through the SSRS Omnibus survey. The SSRS Omnibus is a national, weekly, dual-frame bilingual telephone survey. Each weekly wave of the SSRS Omnibus consists of 1,000 interviews, of which 600 are obtained with respondents on their cell phones, and approximately 35 interviews completed in Spanish.

Because the SSRS Probability Panel recruitment relies on an existing, high-quality survey platform, the result is an affordable probabilistically-sourced sample. Respondents of the SSRS Omnibus represent the full U.S. adult population (English- and Spanish-speaking). From this base, SSRS screens for Internet access and then recruits those who have Internet access<sup>1</sup> to be part of the SSRS Probability Panel.

## Data Collection

### Survey Sampling

All sample members drawn for the CSAF were adult, English-language panelists. Sample drawn for the CSAF was stratified by education due to greater non-response by panelists with lower education.

### Survey Administration Procedures

Surveys conducted using the SSRS Probability Panel are self-administered web surveys. In appreciation for their participation, panelists receive a modest incentive for participation (in the form of an electronic Amazon gift card or cash sent via postal mail according to respondent preference). Depending on the field period, reminder emails are sent to panelists who do not complete the survey after being sent the initial invitation.

For the CSAF study, the survey administration schedule was as follows:

A “soft launch” inviting a limited number of panelists to participate was conducted on June 25th. After checking soft launch data to ensure that all questionnaire content and skip patterns were correct additional sample was released to ensure the final sample was representative.

The median length<sup>2</sup> of the CSAF survey was 22 minutes.

Panelists were emailed an invitation to complete the CSAF survey online. The email for each respondent included a unique passcode-embedded link. In appreciation for their participation, panelists received a seven dollar incentive (in the form of an electronic Amazon gift card). Panelists not responding to their first invitation received a reminder email one week after the

initial invitation, on July 2nd. Three additional rounds of reminders were then sent on July 8<sup>th</sup>, July 10<sup>th</sup>, and July 11<sup>th</sup> to selected respondents in underrepresented demographics who had not yet completed the survey.

As a standard of practice for Probability Panel surveys, quality checks were incorporated into the survey. For CSAF, these included asking respondents to select a specific response when viewing a list of items. Respondents who failed the quality checks employed were not included in the final data set.

As standard practice on web surveys, respondents were allowed to skip any question they did not wish to answer; however, high rates of non-response can be correlated with poor data quality. Notably, 77% of respondents answered 100% of all survey questions, with no one completing less than 91% of the entire questionnaire.

## Response Rate/Cooperation Rate

Response rates are one method used to assess the quality of a survey, as they provide a measure of how successfully the survey obtained responses from the sample. The American Association of Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) has established standardized methods for calculating response rates (AAPOR, 2008). As noted previously, SSRS Panel members are recruited randomly from SSRS Omnibus. The Response Rate for SSRS Omnibus is typically 8%. As noted above, of the Omnibus respondents who are invited to join the SSRS Probability Panel, approximately 45% agree to become part of the panel. Typical cooperation (i.e., completion) rates obtained by the SSRS Probability Panel range from 15% - 20%. The CSAF completion rate is 17.48%.<sup>4</sup>

## Data Processing and Integration

SSRS implemented several quality assurance procedures in data file preparation and processing. In addition to extensive testing of the web survey prior to the launching data collection, random data were generated to ensure that skip patterns were working correctly. After the soft launch, survey data were carefully checked for accuracy, completeness, and non-response to specific questions so that any issues could be identified and resolved prior to the full launch.

The data file programmer implemented a “data cleaning” procedure in which web survey skip patterns were created in order to ensure that all questions had the appropriate numbers of cases. This procedure involved a check of raw data by a program that consisted of instructions derived from the skip patterns designated on the questionnaire. The program confirmed that data were consistent with the definitions of codes and ranges and matched the appropriate bases of all questions. The CSAF survey included only five conditional questions requiring skip logic.

## Weighting

This study, using sample selected from the SSRS Probability Panel, was weighted to provide nationally representative and projectable estimates of the adult population 18 years of age and older. The weighting process takes into account the recruitment of panelists through the SSRS Omnibus, thus the disproportionate probabilities of household and respondent selection due to the number of separate telephone landlines and cellphones answered by Omnibus respondents and their households, as well as the probability associated with the random selection of an individual household member. In addition, a propensity score for joining the SSRS Probability Panel is applied for all respondents of SSRS Omnibus and used as a base-weight for those panelists that complete the survey. Following application of the above weights, the sample was post-stratified and balanced by key demographics such as age, race, sex, region, and education. The sample was also weighted to reflect the distribution of phone usage in the general population, meaning the proportion of those who are cell phone only, landline only, and mixed users. The weighting procedures included three stages, detailed below.

### 1. Total Probability of Selection Weight (Wps)

#### SSRS Omnibus Baseweight

The original SSRS Omnibus inserts were weighted to provide nationally representative and projectable estimates of the adult population 18 years of age and older. The weighting process takes into account the disproportionate probabilities of household and respondent selection due to the number of separate telephone landlines and cellphones answered by respondents and their households, as well as the probability associated with the random selection of an individual household member.

- a. A phone number's probability of being sampled from the landline ( $PN_{LL}$ ) or cell phone ( $PN_{CELL}$ ) sampling frame. This is calculated as:

$$PN_{LL} = S_{LL} / F_{LL}$$
$$PN_{CELL} = S_{CELL} / F_{CELL}$$

Where:

$S_{LL}$  = the size of the landline sample



$F_{LL}$  = the size of the landline sample frame

$S_{CELL}$  = the size of the cell sample

$F_{CELL}$  = the size of the cell sample frame

- b. The probability that a respondent will be selected based on the number of adults in their household. This adjustment is equal to the number of adults in the respondent's household (AD), capped at 3.
- c. Each respondent's access to a landline (LL) and/or cell phone (CP). Respondents reachable by landline were assigned LL=1, those who could not be reached by landline were assigned LL=0. Similarly, respondents who had a cell phone were assigned CP=1 and those without a cell phone were assigned CP=0.

A respondent's probability (PR) of being reached by each phone type was calculated as:

$$\begin{aligned}\text{Landline: } PR_{LL} &= LL \times PN_{LL} / AD \\ \text{Cell Phone: } PR_{CELL} &= CP \times PN_{CELL}\end{aligned}$$

And the overall probability of selection from either was calculated as:

$$P_{(LL \cup CELL)} = PR_{LL} + PR_{CELL} - (PR_{LL} \times PR_{CELL})$$

The base weight adjustment (BW) for probability of selection was calculated as:

$$BW = 1 / P_{(LL \cup CELL)}$$

### SSRS Panel Baseweight

The SSRS Probability Panel weighting procedures take into account the recruitment of panelists through the SSRS Omnibus, thus incorporating the Omnibus baseweight. The SSRS Probability Panel can reach non-Internet households by conducting telephone interviews of these panelists. For researchers who choose to just conduct interviewing of Internet panelists, SSRS applies a propensity score to model non-Internet households so that estimates can be projectable to the full U.S. population. Propensity scores are estimated by fitting a regression of the panel response status on a range of demographic and attitudinal covariates. Adjustments for each panel participant are then calculated as the reciprocal of the estimated response propensity found from the model.

The final SSRS Probability Panel baseweight is then calculated as the product of the panel adjustment and omnibus baseweight, divided by the summated mean of the panel adjustment and omnibus baseweight.

### 2. Post stratification weighting:

The sample was balanced to reflect the distribution of the age 18 or older along known population parameters. Weighting was accomplished using SPSSINC RAKE, an SPSS extension module that simultaneously balances the distributions of all variables using the GENLOG procedure. To handle missing data among some of the demographic variables we employed a technique called hot decking. Hot deck imputation replaces the missing values of a respondent randomly with another similar respondent without missing data. These are further determined by variables predictive of non-response that are present in the entire file.



We used an SPSS macro detailed in 'Goodbye, Listwise Deletion: Presenting Hot Deck Imputation as an Easy and Effective Tool for Handling Missing Data' (Myers, 2011).

The sample was balanced to match estimates from the 2017 Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (CPS)<sup>5</sup>. The population parameters used for post-stratification are: age (18-29; 30-49; 50-64; 65+), gender, Census region (Northeast, North-Central, South, West), Education (high school graduate or less, some college, four-year college or more); race/ethnicity (white non-Hispanic; Black non-Hispanic; Hispanic; Other non-Hispanic); and phone-usage (cell phone only, landline only, both).

Weights were trimmed to prevent individual interviews from having too much influence on the final results. The sample was truncated at the 98<sup>th</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> percentiles.

### Effects of Sample Design on Statistical Analysis

Post-data collection statistical adjustments require analysis procedures that reflect departures from simple random sampling. SSRS calculates the effects of these design features so that an appropriate adjustment can be incorporated into tests of statistical significance when using these data. The so-called "design effect" or *deff* represents the loss in statistical efficiency that results from a disproportionate sample design and systematic non-response. The total sample design effect for this survey is 1.90.

SSRS calculates the composite design effect for a sample of size  $n$ , with each case having a weight,  $w$  as:

$$deff = \frac{n \sum w^2}{(\sum w)^2}$$

In a wide range of situations, the adjusted standard error of a statistic should be calculated by multiplying the usual formula by the square root of the design effect ( $\sqrt{deff}$ ). Thus, the formula for computing the 95% confidence interval around an estimate is:

$$\hat{p} \pm \sqrt{deff} \times 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{\hat{p}(1 - \hat{p})}{n}}$$

where  $\hat{p}$  is the sample estimate and  $n$  is the unweighted number of sample cases in the group being considered.

The survey's margin of error is the largest 95% confidence interval for any estimated proportion based on the total sample — the one around 50%. For example, the margin of error for the entire sample is  $\pm 3.9$  percentage points. This means that in 95 out every 100 samples drawn using the same methodology, estimated proportions based on the entire sample will be no more than 3.9 percentage points away from their true values in the population. Margins of error for subgroups will be larger. It is important to remember that sampling fluctuations are only one possible source of error in a survey estimate. Other sources, such as respondent selection bias, questionnaire wording, and reporting inaccuracy, may contribute additional error of greater or lesser magnitude.

## Deliverables

Final deliverables for this study were a weighted SPSS file, final formatted questionnaire, codebook, and Methodology report.

For the final datafile, please note that when a respondent elected to skip a question they were coded as “-1: Web blank.” A codebook is provided below.

## Datafile Variables and Codebook

The following shows the name and description of each data variable and associated response categories provided in the SPSS file.

For MSTATUS, EMPLOY, ADULTS, KIDSLESS6, KIDSLESS6, KIDS611, KIDS1217, PARENT, AGE, AGE2, AGE3, EDUC sample-based data was only used in in the event the respondent skipped or chose “Prefer not to answer” in the equivalent questions in the demographics section.

For METRO, REGION, and DIVISION sample-based data was only used in the event the respondent skipped, chose “Prefer not to answer,” or gave an invalid zip code in Z-13 and came from landline-based sample. Due to cell phone portability, zip-codes for cell phone-based sample were not utilized in these instances.

For OWNHOME, RACE, REGVOTE, SEX, and RELIGION only sample-based data was used.

For INCOME only data-based responses were used.
